



Erythromycin

- Take Erythromycin as directed. It may be taken with food to eliminate any stomach discomfort.
- If any doctor decides to place you on a new medication, be sure to let them know that you are taking Erythromycin.

For Women:

- Oral antibiotics have been reported in a few instances to have decreased the effectiveness of birth control pills in preventing pregnancy. Erythromycin has very rarely been reported to have done this; however if this is a concern for you, a second method of birth control is advisable.
- Some women get vaginal yeast infections while on oral antibiotics. Notify us if this becomes a problem.
- Do not take this medication if you are pregnant without checking with your obstetrician.
